How we spent our Pupil Premium in 2011-12

The Pupil Premium Grant was used to subsidise enrichment activities especially educational visits. Professional support for children and their families was made available through a Family Support Worker and Community Involvement Officer; additional Educational Psychologist and Speech and Language Therapist time and additional Learning Mentors.

What difference the Pupil Premium made in 2011-12

Outcomes for children at the end of Key Stage 2 showed children on free school meals outperformed their peers nationally in both attainment and progress from KS1. In school data for progress of children on free school meals showed that the progress was above average expectations and kept pace with children not on free school meals.

How we intend to use our Pupil Premium in 2012-13

We will continue to use the effective strategies from the previous year i.e. subsidising enrichment activities especially educational visits; making available professional support for children and their families through a Family Support Worker and Community Involvement Officer; additional Educational Psychologist and Speech and Language Therapist time and additional Learning Mentors. Additionally we have employed additional staff to target support to specific children especially in core skills as well as providing booster sessions for children in year 5 and 6.
