

<p>Listen to the story. Talk about how the little cricket tried to answer to each minibeast he met. Which kind of sounds can you make using different parts of your body?</p>	<p>Look at each character in the story. Count how many characters there are. Draw them in order of size starting with the one you think is the biggest to the one you think is the smallest.</p>	<p>Make your own model of a cricket. You can use playdough, flour or even any empty tubs or boxes you may have. Look carefully at the features your model needs.</p>	<p>In the story the little cricket made a friend at the end of the story. Who is your best friend? What kind of things do you like to do together? Draw a picture of you with your best friend.</p>	<p>Use any resources you have at home to make your own musical instrument.
